Short description of the university programme * Please specify if this is a join/double degree programme (1250 characters)	<p>Curriculum: The BA programme offers a combination of two languages: Japanese and another choice from English, Romanian, Hungarian, German, French, Italian, Spanish, Norwegian, Finnish, Ukrainian, Russian, or classical languages (Latin, Greek, Hebrew), or Comparative Literature; as well as general courses on literary theory, general linguistics, world literature, aesthetics, etc. Japanese can be chosen as a “major” (10 hours a week) or as a “minor” specialization (7-8 hours a week). Classes provide a comprehensive survey of Japanese language, literature and culture, offering both general knowledge and specialized knowledge.</p> <p>The programme intends to answer the necessity of diversifying the academic offer, a need acutely felt in the Transylvanian space, which previously lacked the possibility of systematically and thoroughly studying an Asian language and culture.</p> <p>The programme targets the following main objectives: to ensure a level of practical and theoretical knowledge of Japanese, taking into account all the components implied in such linguistic competence (writing, vocabulary, grammatical structures, comprehension and oral and written expression); to offer fundamental notions and a framework for understanding Japanese literature, with emphasis on the modern and contemporary periods; to provide a detailed understanding of modern and traditional Japanese culture and civilization, with its essential aspects, and, not lastly, to help the students get familiarized with information and research instruments that will grant independent study in this field.</p> <p>At present, the <i>Japanese Language and Literature</i> specialization grants opportunities of studying at foreign universities, in Europe and Japan – for instance, Erasmus agreements with European universities, or student exchange programs with the University of Kobe (Japan) and Ehime University (Japan), Kanagawa University (Japan), Musashino University (Japan).</p> <p>Admission prerequisites: A-levels/baccalaureate</p> <p>Career opportunities: teacher; language trainer; translator/interpreter; diplomat; book editor; journalist; researcher etc.</p> <p>Further academic training: the department offers the opportunity to apply for a PhD program</p>
