Short description of the university programme * Please specify if this is a join/double degree programme (1250 characters)	 The Department of Scandinavian Languages and Literature of the Babeş-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca is the only academic institution in Romania offering a Bachelor programme in Norwegian language and literature, accredited at national level. Norwegian can be chosen as a Major language (10 hours per week) or as a Minor language (7-8 hours per week). A Norwegian language and literature degree diploma is issued at the end of the Bachelor studies. The Norwegian language and literature BA-programme has continuously functioned since 1991 when it was created at the Faculty of Letters. The Nordic Studies Library opened in 1997 represents an important study environment for students and staff. The internationalization of the programme comprises exchange mobility programmes for students and staff at Norwegian visiting professors, meetings with Norwegian writers. The Department of Scandinavian Languages and Literature won an international grant competition for a Norwegian foreign lecturer position supported by Hk-dir. for a period of five years (2020-2025). Curriculum: The BA programme offers a combination of two languages: Norwegian and another choice from Romanian, Hungarian, English, French, German, Russian, Italian, Spanish, Korean, Finnish, Japanese, Chinese, Ukrainian, Latin, Greek, Hebrew or Comparative Literature; as well as general courses on general linguistics, literary theory, aesthetics, world literature, etc. The BA programme provides courses of Norwegian phonetics, morphology, syntax, lexicology, language variation, literature, translation, culture and civilization, didactics as well as one optional course of Swedish.
