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7.2 Specific objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to distinguish one literary movement from another by relating them to the period, to know the major works of the most important Russian writers from the late nineteenth century - the first half of the twentieth century, to interpret literary texts, to make a comparative analysis of literary works, to teach Russian language and literature.

Content of the course: the course deals with the prose of Russian literature of the late XIX-early XX centuries. Emphasis is placed on the historical and cultural context in which Russian literature of this period developed.
